2019 Annual Membership Meeting

All are invited to attend our Annual Membership Meeting! Wednesday, February 27th at the Depot (611 R Ave) Doors open at 6:45 pm. Meeting begins at 7:10 pm.

This free event is a wonderful opportunity for members and non-members alike to get to know more about the Friends of the Forest and our work in service to the Anacortes Community Forest Lands. We will begin with a brief annual report and elections** followed by a special presentation by Dr. Michael Medler, a professor at Huxley College of the Environment at WWU.



Dr. Medler is an associate professor at Western Washington University in the Environmental Studies department. He is a past president of The Association for Fire Ecology, and the founding editor of the scientific journal Fire Ecology. In the 1980s he worked on fire crews in the Pacific Northwest and fought fires across the west including the 1988 fires in Yellowstone. He received a Ph.D. from the University of Arizona in 1997, where he researched improving methods for wildland fire mapping using satellite data. Since that time he has been a wildland fire researcher who has provided information and testimony for groups ranging from the United States Congress, to local homeowners organizations.

His presentation at the annual meeting is titled:

"The Changing Pyrogeography of Fires in the West"

The last few summers have brought about a real reckoning about the "New Normal" we are seeing with wildland fire in the American West. Climate change, building practices, and a century of fire policies have combined to leave many of our forests explosive. Wildland firefighters, trained for work in the backcountry, are increasingly expected to protect homes and communities. Meanwhile, fire-suppression costs are going up even in moderate years, and many people are pressuring wildland agencies to vastly increase the acreage of fuel reduction programs. We are now facing a situation in which we must reevaluate our systematic responses to these fires. Dr. Michael Medler will discuss many of the spatial considerations in this debate, presenting his findings about the spatial scale of some of the problems and the potential of some of the solutions.

Forest fires, exacerbated by new symptoms of climate change, present an ever-growing threat to Fidalgo Island and the ACFL. Our town and forest interface has never been more dynamic; making this topic quite timely. You won't want to miss it!



We are hoping to unveil our new comprehensive ACFL brochure, loaded with maps, trail info, and the history of the forest lands on our island at the Annual Meeting. The Friends are excited to share this long-anticipated resource with our members and the city. Please take a moment to meet and speak with our new Forest Educator, Melissa Courtney, at the event as well. Dessert and refreshments provided by Gere-a-Deli will follow. We can't wait to see you all there.

WHY ARE THE TREES DYING?

Earlier this year, I thought I was imaging things when I really began to notice just how many Western Red Cedar trees have died in the Anacortes Community Forest Lands (ACFL) in the last 6 months... to put it bluntly, 1000's. I invited Denise Crowe, ACFL Naturalist, on a walk down trail 22 where the brown and orange needles of hundreds of dead and dving cedar trees could be easily observed. She too, had been noticing the decline in our forest health. We both concluded that the trees have succumbed to the four summers in a row of drought conditions and warmer weather and warmer winters. Last year, I noticed 100's of Western Hemlock trees were dying as well in the ACFL. Along with the forest lands, I have also been observing trees dying in homeowners' yards all around Anacortes this year. So I began to wonder, is anyone else observing this?



At a recent tree seminar I attended called "Healthy Trees, Healthy Communities" I decided to present this question to the instructor Ben Thompson, Urban Forestry Specialist with WA State Dept. of Natural Resources. His direct answer was YES. Tree mortality was being observed all around western Washington with pocket areas in rain shadows (like Anacortes) seeing a higher mortality rate. He stated there has also been an unusual mortality in Big Leaf Maples in certain locations in our State as well. So the next question I asked was "why"?

Mr. Thompson stated that it is tough to prove drought stress is causing trees to die, but the stress put on trees from lack of water makes them susceptible to diseases and insect pests which are identifiable. Dan Omdal, WA State Forest Pathologist, said he has been observing Western Red Cedar mortality at sites around Mount Vernon and at Deception Pass since 2015, the beginning of our 4-year drought. Observations of drought-stressed trees may include a tree dropping some of its needles or leaves to conserve water. The growth rings in a tree trunk

will be smaller during drought periods. Branch and/ or tree top die-off can be observed during drought conditions. But the overall belief from scholars and tree management professionals is that our trees are dying from drought related conditions and warmer weather patterns. These conditions weaken a tree's defense and allow for disease and pests to come in and finish off the tree. Continued drought conditions can create embolisms in a tree's water vessels, preventing the tree's vascular system from operating effectively. The tree essentially dries out and dies. Some trees may appear green and healthy, but they are reaching their threshold to hold on, and certain tree species in the ACFL have tipped over that threshold. I have observed recently Western Hemlocks snapping in half midway up the tree, only to find the inside of the trunk dry and soft, unable to hold itself up anymore. And dead cedar trees can be observed along almost every trail in the ACFL. At first it was just the small 2-4" diameter trees, but recently I am seeing the 24" trees dead as well.

What does the future hold for our trees? Maybe a new ecosystem of different, more tolerant tree species. Maybe we will get back to a more "normal" weather pattern, but experts say this is the new "normal". San Diego, Washington.








Winter Calendar 2019

Take a walk with Ranger Dave to explore and examine trees dying in the ACFL, presumed to be caused by the last 4 years of draught-like conditions specifically here on Fidalgo Island, a rain shadow area of the Pacific NW. Dave will take you on a journey pointing out subtle to dramatic changes that have occurred in the past few years to our resident trees and understory. Dave, who is also a Certified Arborist with a B.S. in Natural Resources Management, will present some technical observations from an arboricultural point of view. Let's meet at the Whistle Lake parking lot off Whistle Lake Road. Be sure to dress warmly and have a good pair of hiking boots. A camera may be an item to bring along as well. Work Parties

Invasive Holly Removal • Saturday, January 26th • 9am-11am

Dan Senour, hiker representative for the ACFL Trail Committee has spotted a large patch of non-native invasive holly growing along trail 21 that needs to be removed. Let's meet at trailhead 215 on Ray Auld Drive at the base of Mt. Erie Road. From there we will hike to trail 21 via 215 and 320. It's about a 15-minute walk to the holly site. We will have all the tools, just bring gloves, boots, and dress warmly. If it's snowing, super windy, or raining hard, we will re-schedule.

Heart Lake Road Clean-up • Saturday, February 23rd • 9am-11am

It's time for our annual hunt for treasures along Heart Lake Road and to pick up the trash along the road and parking lots. In the past we have found bird feeders, pocket knives, and hundred dollar bills! What will we find this time? Let's meet at trailhead 215 on Ray Auld Drive at the base of Mt. Erie Road.
