When I first started as Executive Director of Friends of the Forest in 2019, the entire organization was brimming with potential. I remember the feeling of being on a new horizon, entering an atmosphere of dedication and vision, piloted by people that had worked incredibly hard over many years to bring the organization forward on a shoestring budget and with minimal staff. Covered in volunteer fingerprints and with immense support from the community, Friends of the Forest was at a critical juncture as to how to move forward to address the ever-shifting challenges and questions facing the Anacortes Community Forest Lands. Seeing the potential that lay within and dreaming big in scope of programs, they took a leap and decided to invest in staffing to carry forward the vision of what could be.

The excitement was palpable when I began to work here, both internally and amongst the community. It was thrilling and nerve-racking and difficult to navigate, but also fun and new. Even as I entered into the organization, I could see the vast potential and the myriad challenges we'd face as we moved forward to reach that potential, including the necessity to bring on more full-time staff to navigate the different avenues ahead.

Of course, no one could have predicted one of the largest challenges of all: a global pandemic that would isolate us from one another, at least physically, for years to come. But even something as impactful as Covid couldn't prevent our community from recognizing and prioritizing the incredible gift that is the ACFL; ironically, through the massive influx of forest users, it catalyzed the forest's fragility for many of us.

Community Science Wetlands Monitoring - Easy - Location TBA - We meet on the second Friday of each month to monitor the water quality in the wetlands around Little Cranberry Lake and Big Beaver Pond. Wear weather-proof clothes and bring your curiosity! Location changes each month and will be emailed to registered participants prior to the event.

Magnificent Mosses - Easy - Little Cranberry Lake parking lot - Winter is a spectacular time to appreciate the beauty and diversity of the nonvascular plants of the Pacific Northwest! Join us on a hike with guest naturalist Elizabeth Drozda-Freeman to celebrate the magnificent mosses of the ACFL, and gain new appreciation for the big jobs that these little plants can do.

Senior Stroll - Easy - Whistle Lake parking lot - Join Friends of the Forest on an immersive stroll through the Anacortes Community Forest Lands, where we'll explore the areas around the ACFL's deepest lake! We'll keep the pace of this hike slow as the group's curiosity guides our learning, so feel free to bring your own field guides, binoculars/magnifiers, and whatever gear you'll need for walking on trails.

Macroinvertebrates - Easy - Location TBA - We meet every other month to examine the macroinvertebrates in the wetlands around Little Cranberry Lake and Big Beaver Pond. Macroinvertebrates, or the aquatic bugs and larvae that call our wetlands home, are fantastic indicator species that give us clues about the health of our waterways. Wear weather-proof clothes and bring your buggiest enthusiasm!

Family Nature Walk - Easy - Ray Auld Drive parking lot - Our theme will be... Trees! We will hug trees, measure trees, smell trees, and do a nature craft with trees. We will also have a snack time where we will read a story about trees and talk about how human food is different from tree food. Bring the whole family and join us for a real "tree-t" of a hike!

New Youth Programs for 2023

We are so excited to be adding several new youth programs to our menu in 2023! Thanks to all of you and your support in expanding our team to two full time educators, we are working hard on increasing opportunities for youth and community programs in the ACFL. New this year we are adding a week-long half day camp (Young Explorers) for grades K–2, and a science and problem solving spring break camp for grades 6–8 in April (Science Sleuths). These will join our foundational programs including After School in the ACFL, school field trips and classroom visits for kindergarten, 3rd grade and 7th grade, Forest Discovery (our summer program), and monthly family hikes.

Young Explorers | Feb. 13–17 | Grades K–2

This new program focuses on creating and growing a sense of wonder while we play and get to know the forest. Each day we will focus on using our senses, asking questions and creating experiments to explore our daily themes. From soil experiments to making our own instruments and investigating macroinvertebrates, each child will unlock their inner scientist and storyteller while having fun in the forest. Kindergarten Fall Field Trip

Science Sleuths | April 3-7 | Grades 6-8

Our new spring break camp extends our outside of school programming to students in middle school who are interested in honing their science skills and inner detective. During our week-long investigation we will investigate a fictional ACFL ecosystem mystery and use science, inquiry, and teamwork to find the culprit and develop a plan for restoration. Registration will open in late February for our inaugural sleuths.

This spring we will also continue our After School in the ACFL with a February/March session for students in grades 3–5 and an April/May session for students in grades K–2. Registration for each session will be posted on our website one month in advance.

Thank you for making these new and continuing programs accessible for all students in Anacortes. These free programs would not be possible with-out the support of our dedicated members.

A New-and-Improved Naturalist Club in 2023!



Friends of the Forest's Naturalist Club is back and better than ever! Starting March 2, join us for 10 weeks of immersive learning about the Anacortes Community Forest Lands!

Connect with fellow life-long learners, and complete projects that will deepen your connection to and curiosity about the natural world. All learners of any experience are welcome!

Every other Thursday, Naturalist Club members will attend a skills-based class at the Anacortes Depot (611 R Avenue), each focusing on a different aspect of Fidalgo Island and ACFL ecology. On alternating Saturdays, we'll meet out in the ACFL itself and put some of those classroom skills to practice. Participants

will explore their basic naturalist skills, learn to identify the common plants and animals of the ACFL, and investigate how the components of the ACFL are connected - to each other and to us!

Each class will spark curiosity about the incredible diversity and complexity of the ACFL ecosystems while aiming to inspire participants to become better observers of the outdoors. By the end of this course, participants will have added to their understanding of and deepened their connection to their world. Excited to join us? Wetlands Monitoring 2022 Retrospective

THANK YOU to the 16 volunteers who contributed roughly 55 hours to the wetlands monitoring project in 2022! We waded through mud, smoke, wind, and rain to collect lots of great data on the water quality of wetlands near Little Cranberry Lake. With one year of data on our wetlands' dissolved oxygen concentration, pH, temperature, and carbon dioxide concentrations, we are beginning to put together the story of water quality in the ACFL. We can't wait to see you out in the forest again soon. For more details on our 2023 monitoring efforts, keep reading!

Macroinvertebrates

Our volunteers are powerhouses of community science, and collect data each month that helps us tell a scientifically-informed story about the wetlands around Little Cranberry Lake and Big Beaver Pond. We completed our first year of data collection last year! (continued on next page)

In 2023, we'll continue monitoring the water quality of our wetlands on the second Friday of each month. Additionally, we will examine the macroinvertebrates (aquatic water bugs!) in our wetlands every other month, starting in February 2023.

Macroinvertebrates are a powerful biological indicator of water quality. Instead of "snapshot" measurements of water quality, which only reflect the characteristics of the sample at the moment the sample was taken, the diversity of macroinvertebrates present in a water body represent a more holistic, longitudinal indicator of site quality.

"Community" science means that anyone, from beginners to experts, can participate. We love our dedicated volunteers and seeing new faces, too, so join us!
